## **Dreamland :**

Its home for the Children in need of care and protection. SEDT started with this project under which presently 60 children are covered. These children stay here and go to the school , both outside school and school started by the organization (primary). These children are taken care by a team under guidance of Maniktai .

Apart from basic needs of these children like food – clothing etc, attention also is given to their intellectual and emotional requirements. Computers with CDs for regular study are provided, special recreational aids are available and team of staff and other volunteers are looking to care these children to develop them in proper manner. Special library is there. Gym for regular exercise and good play ground too is provided with required sports material.

Good residential building – with enough open space , garden – tree plantation, attached complex of sanitation block – with Solar water heating system is provided.

This year also we have started 25KW solar electricity plant in the campus, so no problem of load shading. Children can study regularly in light.

## **Shree Sant Dnyaneshwar Vidyalaya – Kerwadi**

In the school run by the institute classes till 7<sup>th</sup> standard are conducted. Currently there are 309 students in the school and additional 40 children in Balwadi. The school runs different schemes for the all round growth and development of the children.

The year started with welcoming the new students. As usual events such as class decoration competition, tree planting, neighbourhood cleaning etc. were conducted for the children to create liking for cleanliness and nature love among the children. Also drawing, good thoughts collection, rangoli, dictation competitions were conducted for the children. To improve their general knowledge various visits to educational institutions, historic places, science centre were organized. Along with that, games, yoga, exercises are taught to keep them fit and healthy.

This year new projects such as school without schoolbag, improving handwriting, saving bank of children, writing diary were run for the children. Along with festivals, birth anniversaries, Teachers' day, Children's day, Marathwada independence day were also celebrated and their importance was explained to the children.

Several parents' meetings were organised to talk to them. The parents make their suggestion in writing to the school and the same is discussed in the open forum.

This year the annual gathering day was celebrated 23<sup>rd</sup> January 2020. On this occasion all children have shown various cultural activities like dancing, singing, small dramas, poems, etc. Ambassadors from US were present for this gathering.



### **Women empowerment Cell :**

Women from the SHGs have form Credit Co-operative Society under the guidance of the organization. Now we are empowering women by giving small loans to these women through Credit Co-operative Society.

Women have started small businesses like Grocery shops, dairy uints, goat raring through the small loans and increased their family income.

Also this year some of the women formed Gramsangh under MSRLM scheme under the guidance of SEDT. Hon. Collector have issued Soya Milk plant to this Gramsangh. In July 2019, the Soya milk plant was opened in the presence of Collector Mr. P Shivashankar and CEO ZP Mr. B.P. Pruthwiraj.

The Gramsangh is supplying Soya Paneer to the KGVV schools in the district.



### **Introducing Poly House technology to women farmers in rural villages for better livelihood :**

With support of Department of Science and Technology, Govt. of India, we are working in the area to introduce polyhouse technology to small women farmers, so they can increase their income. Under this project we have –

- Established Demo unit of low cost poly house and Shednet .
- Trained 54 women farmers ( 6 days) training on polyhouse /shednet technology. Resource person from ARTI, Phaltan have conducted training. Taluka Agriculture Officer and his team also visited the training program and demo unit and given information about Govt schemes related polyhouse and shednet.
- 533 women farmers have visited the demo unit of polyhouse and shednet.



Such Green -houses provide a possibility of multifold production of any vegetation grown in it. Additionally, fruits, vegetables or flowers are grown with consistent quality and with fewer amounts of resources. The saving typically is on water, fumigation and pest control.

These structures are less heat conducting meaning that temperature variation outside the green-house is less proportionately transferred inside. So inside these green – houses, plants feel less hot in scorching sunny conditions and warmer in extreme cold conditions compar. to metal Polly houses. In our area temperature fluctuation is quite high, but for more time its very high, in March April it reaches 45°C .

### **WOMEN'S Counseling Center :**

Women and Child Development Department –Govt of Maharashtra , has established a counselling cell for helping women at several dist. For Parbhani dist Govt have selected our institution and we established such centre under their guidelines , to protect women's rights and justice.

These cells have been established in the offices of Dist Police Superintendent 's officers. For this purpose two women counsellors are appointed in each district.

What ever cases of women related register at police station, they refer such cases to our cell or if someone(woman) comes with a complaint, it is firstly noted in the cell. The counsellors investigate the complaint and try to resolve the matter by meeting the family. If necessary, the counsellors help the women to get legal help and justice. The police offices give full co-operation to the counsellors.

This year we have conducted awareness programs at Tadkalas, Asola, Navha and Parbhani city, in which near about 700 women and 200 adolescent girls were covered.

This year there were 84 cases registered with the cell, out of that 53 cases have resolved and the family were living together, whereas 6 cases were referred to Protection Officer to file the case in the court, in 7 cases FIR were filed under section 498. way monthly about 7 to 8 cases are registered and attempt is made by the counsellors to resolve them / support the women with legal guidance if required.

### **Discovery Science Center :**

We have established 25 small science centers in Ashram Schools of Tribal department in 6 districts.

This year also 7500 school children form nearby area visited Discovery Center. Every day there is a fix program for visitors of D.C., in which we are trying to share few concepts of D.C. The activities in D.C. include D.C. Exhibits, Hobby workshop, Theatre activity and stage courage activity. More or less we are trying to cover all above activities and share with them as per the time available. At the end of day program we are also taking feed back from the student in the form of question and answer to share and express their thoughts.

In the month of January , 6 days robotics training was conducted in Discovery center in which 24 children have participated and make a program for working robo. At end of the training they have made demo for other children. For this training program we have received support from Transnetyx team from US and Science in a Suitcase.





### **Targeted Interventions :**

We are working with MSACS on Targeted Interventions Project. It is working on Prevention of HIV/AIDS & STI with High Risk Group FSW (Female Sex Worker), MSM ( Men Having Sex With Men) and Tamasha Artists. Main purpose of this project is to give medical support, behavior change communication, care & support to PLHIV.

#### **Unit 1 –**

In this project we were covering 1200 population of FSWs from Parbhani city . There were 15 Peer Educators, 5 Outreach workers, One Counselor, One M and E Officer and One Program Manager in this unit.

While working on 52 sites we arrange the monthly meetings on these hot spots & discuss the issues like reducing the risk factor, regular HIV testing, VDRL testing, clinical checkups, minimize the crisis among the KPs, their social entitlement, Care & support of the PLHIVs, use of condom, and awareness of the TB in the

community. Our counselor assesses the risk of the key population and also we arrange the field level group counseling sessions for the community members. We discuss the risk reduction issues in this group. The care and support of the PLHAs is also done by our counselor. Thorough DIC meetings we discussed on the Sexually transmitted infections and also arranged the meetings of the STI patients in DIC.

## UNIT- II

Socio Economic Development Trust works thorough the Targeted intervention program which is funded by Maharashtra Aids Control Program among the female sex workers and male sex workers (both said as key population hence forth) in Jintur,

Selu, Pathri , Gangakhed & Purna block in Parbhani district with a view to reduce the HIV infection and eradicate the sexually transmitted infections from these key population. Targeted Intervention project unit 2 works for the Female sex workers who hide their identity to their family and nearest people. Often in the terms of project they are called as slum base sex workers. This is very major task to identify and convince them for services and other health facilities which are beneficial for them.

In our outreach staff we are having 10 Peer Educators who are supervised by our 3 Outreach workers. We also have one counselor one Monitoring and evaluation cum account officer and one Program Manager in our staff.

### Unit III :

SEDT works thorough the Targeted intervention program among the male sex workers ( said as key population hence forth) in Parbhani district with a view to reduce the HIV infection and eradicate the sexually transmitted infections from these key population. Targeted Intervention project unit 3 works for the Homo sexual in the project language it is called as male having sex with male. While working with this population we identified various typologies available in the Parbhani area, like Kothi, panthi, Double Deker some Transgender are also there.

In our outreach staff we are having 13 Peer Educators who are supervised by our 4 Outreach workers. We also have one counselor one Monitoring and Evaluation cum Account officer and one Program Manager.

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### **Link Workers Scheme :**

The scheme aims at building a rural community model to address the complex needs of rural HIV prevention, care and support requirements in selected geographies, reaching out to rural population who are vulnerable and are at risk of HIV/AIDS in a non-stigmatized enabling environment, improving access to information materials, commodities (condoms, needles/syringes) through collaborating with nearest TI or government health facilities, testing and treatment services ensuring there is no duplication of services or resources, improving linkage to other social and health benefits provided by other line departments in line with local norms, regulations suitable for vulnerable populations.

Link Worker Scheme supported and linkages to Social Protection and Social benefit Scheme issued to PLHIV members and their family in this year lin to various social benefit scheme to PLHIV such as 4 Children received Balsangopan Yojna benefit, 4 PLHIV family received Rajiv Gandhi Arogya Yojna benefit , 2 PLHIV received free bus pass for traveling in district for collect ART medicine.

**One Stop Center :**

To provide integrated support and assistance to women by violence, both in private and public spaces under one roof. To facilitate immediate, emergency and non-emergency access to a range of services including medical, legal, psychological and counseling support under one roof to fight against any forms of violence against women.

The OSC will support all women including girls below 18 years of age affected by violence, irrespective of caste, class religion, region, sexual orientation or marital status. For girls below 18 years of age. Institutions and authorities established under Juvenile Justice (Care and protection of Children) Act 2018 and protection of Children from sexual Offences Act 2012 will be linked with the OSC.

We have handled 65 cases during last one year and providing facility as per need to different case categories. The case categories are Rape-03, Child sexual abuse – 16, Missing – 36, Domestic Violence – 01, Other -09 (special need).
